1. Gold-plated bowl Used as a Ciborium. Gold-plated bowl previously used by Monsignor Carfagna as a young priest in masses as a receptacle for the Eucharist. Minimum bid -- \$20.
2. Six-piece, Limited-Edition Globe Nativity Set by Gianni Benvenuti. Hand-painted and numbered. Includes. Individually numbered pieces include the following: (1) Tidings of Great Joy; (2) A King Is Born; (3) Visitation of the Shepherds; (4) The Little Drummer Boy; (5) Gifts from the Townspeople; and (6) Gift of the Magi. Minimum bid -- \$50.
3. Music Box – "Santa's Sleigh of Wonder." Bavarian Heritage. Musical - Plays *O Tannenbaum*. BH1012M. Coyne's and Company, #1038/3500. Minimum bid -- \$25.

7. Framed Picture of Mary. The frame was made by Monsignor Carfagna when he was a seminarian. The depiction of Mary is a parchment print. Minimum bid -- \$25.
8. Ceramic Bust of the Christ Child Entitled "Innocence". Made in Mexico in 1981 by Ceramica Excelsis -- Limited edition -- number 645 of 5000. Minimum bid -- \$25.

Group B-Bidding ends at 6:45 Figurines/Plates

1. "The Wizard" – Royal Doulton. Reminiscent of Merlin from King Arthur's Court, this limited-edition rendition was created by A. Maslankowski in 1978. HN 2877. "Royal Doulton" is an English manufacturer of ceramic and other goods, founded in 1815, as Jones, Watts & Doulton. In 1901, King Edward VII awarded the business a Royal Warrant, permitting it to use new markings and the new name of "Royal Doulton." Minimum bid -- \$25.
2. Royal Doulton Mr. Pickwick. Ceramic depiction by Royal Doulton of Mr. Pickwick, from Charles Dickens' first novel, *The Pickwick Papers*. The kindly Mr. Pickwick has been the subject of many ceramic depictions. Minimum Bid - \$25.
3. Mr. Pickwick. Another depiction of Mr. Pickwick from Charles Dickens' first novel, *The Pickwick Papers*. Made by Bossons in Congleton, England in 1964. Minimum bid -- \$10.
4. Wood Frog. Items 4 and 5 were hand-carved by Father Thomas Loya, a Byzantine priest ordained in 1982. He is co-founder of Tabor Life Institute and hosts "Light of the East" radio show, which is heard in more than 60 cities. Before entering the seminary, he graduated from the Cleveland Institute of Art and pursued a career in commercial art design. Minimum Bid -- \$15.
5. Wood Owl. Minimum Bid -- \$15. See information in #4 about the artist, Father Thomas Loya.
6. Ceramic Frog. Minimum Bid -- \$10.
7. Bust of William Shakespeare. Austin Production. Minimum Bid -- \$25.
8. Hand-Carved, Wooden Statue of Don Quixote. Minimum Bid -- \$25.
9. Barsottini Friar John Wine Decanter Set. Made in Italy in 1970. Minimum Bid -- \$25.
10. Limited Edition German Porcelain Plates Depicting The Frog King-#8866 and Puss N Boots-#2591. Created by Gerda Neubacher and made by Kaiser. Minimum Bid -- \$20.
11. Limited-Edition, Delft Plate. "The Royal Oak". Made in Denmark, Minimum Bid-- \$25.

1. Framed 8½" x 11" Sketch by Monsignor Carfagna Depicting Mountains and Trees. Created in January 2013. Minimum Bid - \$25.
2. Hand-Carved, Centuries-Old Wood Door. Given to Monsignor by his English professor Father George Berwanger when Monsignor was a seminarian. - Minimum Bid -- \$25.
3. Brass Chest on Wooden Stand. Made by Wildwood Accents in Hong Kong. -- Minimum Bid -- \$25.
4. Metal stand with Gold Bulb -- \$15.
5. Hand-Crafted Antique Lamp. Minimum Bid -- \$25.
6. Teak/Marble Curio Stand. Minimum Bid -- \$10.
7. Decorative Teapot. Made in England by Sadler. Minimum Bid -- \$15.
8. Teapot and Cups. Made at The Hall China Company located in East Liverpool, Ohio. After World War I, Hall China became the largest producer of decorative teapots in the world until teapot sales declined in America, beginning in the 1940s. Minimum Bid -- \$25.
9. Mantel Clock. Made by The Bombay Company in 2002. Minimum Bid -- \$25.
10. Framed "Stormy Landscape" print by Rembrandt- Minimum Bid -- \$20.
